





MINIMUM PERIODS OF EXCLUSION FROM SCHOOL, PRE-SCHOOL AND CHILDCARE FACILITIES FOR CHILDREN OR STAFF WITH, OR EXPOSED TO, INFECTIOUS DISEASES CONDITION ACTION **EXCLUSION OF CASE** Exclude until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours^b if affecting 2 or Cytomegalovirus (CMV) infection Conjunctivitis Exclude until discharge from the eyes has stopped, unless a doctor has diagnosed non-infectious Not excluded Cryptosporidium Exclude until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours^b Not excluded Exclude until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours^b Not excluded Diarrhoea (no organism identified) Fungal infections of the skin or nails (e.g. ringworm, tinea) Exclude until the day after starting appropriate Not excluded Exclude until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours^b Not excluded Giardiasis Glandular fever (mononucleosis, Epstein-Barr virus (EBV) infection) Not excluded Not excluded Hand, foot and mouth disease Exclude until all blisters have dried Not excluded.

The child does not need to be sent home immediately if head lice are detected Head lice (pediculosis) Not excluded Not excluded.

Not excluded if the person can maintain hygiene proclicus to minimise the raik of transmission.

If the person cannot comply with these practices e.g., because they are too youngl, they should be excluded until the sores are dry.

Sores should be covered with a dressing, where possible Herpes simplex (cold sores, fever blisters) Not excluded Human immunodeficiency virus Not excluded If the person is severely immune compromised, they will be vulnerable to other people's illnesses Human parvovirus B19 (fifth disease, erythema infectiosum, slapped cheek syndrome) Not excluded Not excluded Hydatid disease Not excluded Not excluded Any sores on exposed skin should be covered with a watertight dressing Exclude until person is well Influenza and influenza-like illnesses ▶ Listeriosis Not excluded Not excluded Immunised and immune contacts are not excluded. All immunocompromised children should be excluded until 14 days after the appearance of the rash in the last case Meningitis (viral) Exclude until person is well Not excluded Not excluded.

Contact Centre for Disease Control for specialist advice about screening, antibiotics or specialist TB clinics Tuberculosis (TR) 盃 Exclude until medical certificate is produced from the appropriate health authority Any child with an immune deficienc (for example, leukaemia) or receiving chemotherapy should be excluded for their own protection as they are at high risk of developing severe disease.

Otherwise, not excluded. Exclude until all blisters have dried—this is usually at least 5 days after the rash first appeared in non-immunised children, and less in immunised children Not excluded Viral gastroenteritis (viral diarrhoea) Exclude until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 24 hours^b

 If the cause is instructiven, possible exclusion for 48 hours, at life cause is identified. However, educators and other safet who have a food handling role should always be excluded until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 48 hours. Adapted from SA Health Communicable Disease.
